PERMIT OF ENTRY FOR INVASIVE SPECIES CONTROL

Non-native, invasive species are on the increase throughout the Tualatin Basin. Some species spread along stream corridors either by seed or by fragments that float downstream and become established. Some invasive species can be controlled by timely pulling or cutting, while others require herbicide treatment for one or more seasons. In many cases, early intervention can prevent the need for costly and environmentally damaging control efforts.

Prior to working on your property, Clean Water Services (District) must secure your permission to enter. If you agree to allow the District and its contractors to enter upon your property to control invasive species, please fill in the blanks below with your name, street address, county, signature and today's date.
